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About This Directory

The first Delta’s Social Action Plan was developed in 2018. To inform the Social Action Plan an initial overview of social infrastructure and community needs was conducted in 2017 and summarized in the 2017 Social Profile; as a part of this process, the first inventory of social services in Delta was developed (Social Profile - Appendix A). In 2021, the City of Delta initiated an update of the 2018 Social Action Plan. As a result, the directory of social services in Delta has been updated.

This directory contains social service providers, organizations, and agencies who serve citizens of the City of Delta. Also included are the sector-based community tables that bring together community partners to work on community-wide issues (food security, children and youth, etc.). Over 180 directory listings are organized in alphabetical order. Services provided through the City of Delta are listed in a separate section.

Seniors Centres are provided in each of the three major Delta neighbourhoods: Kennedy in North Delta, McKee in Ladner and KinVillage in Tsawwassen. The City is in the process of opening up a licensed preschool program in three of its locations. The program will start either September 2021 or September 2022. The City would offer both the unlicensed and licensed option. The new licensed spaces would offer longer hours, subsidies, and support for children with needs.

City of Delta – Emergency Support Services (ESS)

ESS, managed by the Parks, Recreation and Culture Department, is an emergency response program that provides services required to support people affected by an emergency or a disaster. ESS staff and volunteers are prepared to meet all the needs of the community for the first 72 hours following an emergency event. The services are funded by the Corporation of Delta and provincial/federal emergency services.
