## In-person School Programs available:

### Cedar, Wool & Feathers - Grades K-2

Textile arts help us convey our complex identities. Learn about how natural resources contribute to Delta's diverse cultural fabric. Practice your weaving skills and help create a class quilt in this engaging and tactile program.

## Discovering Delta - Grades 3-4

How does the geography and ecology of Delta affect its development? Learn how a delta is formed through a live water table demonstration, explore Delta's four ecosystems through a hands-on activity and complete a thematic TRAIL scavenger hunt.

#### Immigration Stories - Grades 5-6

How do immigrants shape the cultural landscape of Delta? Discover stories of Delta's immigrant populations, the hardships they face, and how they have become key members of Delta's communities through a point-based scavenger hunt.

#### Winter Wander – Grades 3-6

This holiday season between November 12th - December 20th, wander down to the Discovery Centre to learn all about how Delta's communities celebrated during the holiday months. Explore how they braved life in cold temperatures by completing a winter themed TRAIL scavenger hunt and completing a winter craft to take home.

#### Digging Roots – Grade 7

Learn about the importance of agricultural roots to ancient civilizations such as Mesopotamia and Ancient China through a one-of-a-kind board game. Students will be split into groups and assigned a civilization. Their goal is to complete their settlement by gaining and trading resources, all while encountering roadblocks such as climate catastrophes or military conquests.

#### Delta Deep Dive – Grades 8-12 & Adult ELL

Dive deep into Delta's past with help from one of the Discovery Centre's knowledgeable educators. Consider how colonization, Canadian identity, injustices, industry, immigration and local conflicts have affected Delta's diverse communities through a guided tour and discussion-based activity.

#### Self-Guided Exploration – Ages 5+

Learn about Delta's rich past through a physical and digital experience. Follow the TRAIL system to take an interactive tour through our themed kiosks and explore the rest of the exhibitions through a structured self-guided tour.

#### Private Guided Tour – Ages 5+

Discover some of Delta's stories, objects, belongings, and communities during a highlights tour through our exhibitions. Each tour features family-friendly activities led by our experienced staff.
