Make your own newspaper kitchen container liner







Line your kitchen catcher with alternating layers of newspaper to keep it clean and prevent material from sticking.



DON'T

Line your container with plastic bags or compostable plastic bags. They interrupt the composting process and contaminate the load.



DO

Wrap your scraps! Use newspaper, paper towel, paper bags or cereal/cracker boxes to wrap scraps before putting them in your green can.

Note: do not line containers with plastic bags, including compostable or biodegradable plastic
