## **Guide – Residential Demolition Permit**





## Demolish an existing house, accessory building or swimming pool and cap existing service connections

In order to demolish a house, swimming pool, or an accessory structure larger than 10 m<sup>2</sup> (108 ft<sup>2</sup>), a demolition permit application is required. A security deposit will be required to maintain the municipal curb, gutter and roadway during demolition. **Prior to demolishing the building, you must:** 

- Be issued a demolition permit (can be sent via email);
- Protect any trees on-site (inspection required); and
- Cap existing service connections at the property line (inspection required).

Once the above is completed, you can proceed with demolishing the structure and completing the final inspections to have your deposit returned.



If your house is a protected heritage building, your demolition permit may be withheld in accordance with a heritage agreement or the *Local Government Act*. Contact the Application Centre for more information.

If the property is on a steep slope, a geotechnical report will be required. You can check DeltaMap or contact the Application Centre to confirm if the property is on a steep slope.

## What to Expect:

Following submission of a completed Residential Demolition Permit application, the applicant must:

- 1. Pay the required security deposit(s) and sign the permits.
- 2. Install tree protection fencing for any retained trees (a separate <u>Tree Removal Permit</u> application is required if any trees are proposed to be removed) and book the tree protection inspection.
- 3. Cap services at the property line and schedule the service capping inspection online.
- 4. Demolish the buildings/structures and schedule the demolition inspection online.
- 5. Book the boulevard inspection to have your security deposit(s) returned to you.
